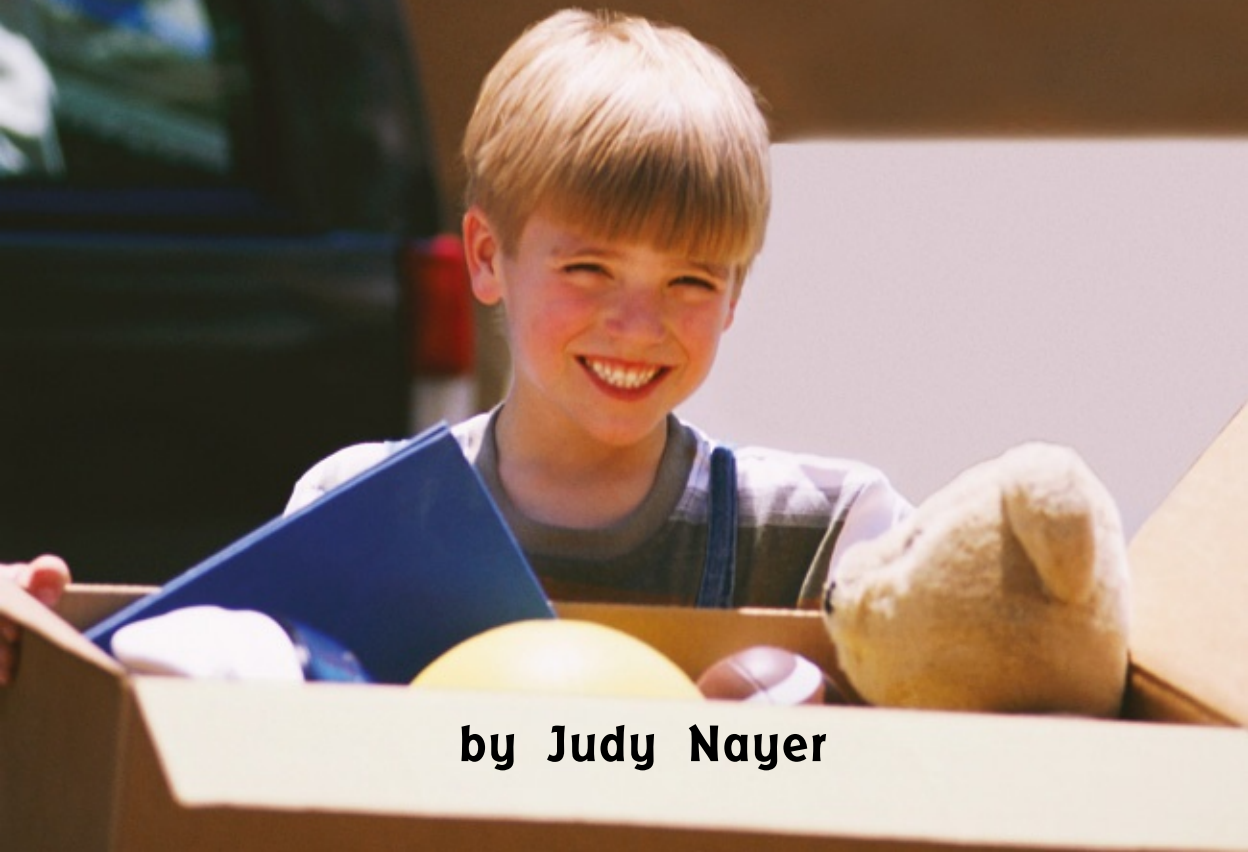

Use what you find. Make a work of art out of it. Show your creation to your friends after you are done!





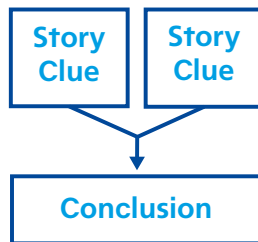


Tell them you have saved
